

New visitor attraction: An immersive experience that showcases Canada's Parliament

Ottawa, Ontario August 15, 2023

The Speaker of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Commons announced today that *Parliament: The Immersive Experience* will open to the public on August 17, 2023. Tickets are available at no cost at **visit.parl.ca**.

Produced by the Library of Parliament, this 45-minute multimedia attraction takes visitors on a 360° journey through the main Parliament Building, also known as Centre Block, which closed in 2019 for long-term rehabilitation. The experience brings the history, art and architecture of this iconic building to life in vivid sensory detail.

Located at 211 Sparks Street in downtown Ottawa, the attraction includes an exhibit, as well as an immersive show featuring large-scale projections of key spaces in the main Parliament Building, including the Senate, House of Commons, Library of Parliament, Peace Tower and Memorial Chamber. With immersive sound, narration and visual effects, it also spotlights some of the decisions and debates that took place at Parliament over almost 100 years.
