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Executive Summary

CAPACOA supports for the recommendations made by the Canadian Arts Coalition and Imagine Canada.

Canadian Arts Coalition's recommendations:

Increase the Canada Council for the Arts' Parliamentary appropriation by \$35 million in 2015 with a long-term goal of reaching \$300 million.

Increase Canada's presence on the world stage for 2017 by establishing a \$25 million pilot program over three years at the Department of Foreign Affairs, Trade and Development for Canada's 150th birthday.

Investigate new revenue models to support a comprehensive Canadian Cultural Digital Strategy that would enable the creation, dissemination and engagement of Canadian cultural content online.

Imagine Canada's main recommendation:

Building on the First-Time Donor's Super Credit announced in 2013, implement the Stretch Tax Credit for Charitable Giving to promote a culture of long-term and incremental giving.

We believe these recommendations address the key themes of the pre-budget consultations, are extremely reasonable in light of the current fiscal context, and would yield tangible benefits for Canadians in all regions of the country.
