Recall of the House

Ottawa, Ontario – September 13, 2022

Pursuant to Standing Order 28(3), the Honourable Anthony Rota, Speaker of the House of Commons, has given notice for the House to meet on **Thursday, September 15, 2022, at 10:00 a.m.**, to pay tribute to Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II following her passing.

Additional background

<u>Standing Order 28(3)</u> provides the means by which the House may be recalled. This process usually begins with a government request made in writing to the Speaker. The decision to recall is taken by the Speaker, after consultation with the government and once the Speaker is satisfied that the public interest would be served by an earlier meeting of the House. Unless a motion is adopted that provides for a change to the daily order of business, proceedings are held in the usual manner depending on the time of the meeting of the House. When the House sits on a Saturday or Sunday, the order of business will be that of a Friday sitting.
